Ear Clinic is a private ENT consultation facility, which until July 2018, was not open to the public. Ear Clinic offers first-class facilities with the highest levels of equipment, expertise and care.

The Ear Clinic is located on the ground floor with the waiting area just inside the main entrance of Lymington Business Centre. This page details the process and equipment used for the removal of excessive wax. Seated in an electrically adjustable chair, you are comfortable and in just the right place for us to work safely.


Welcome: On arrival you will be asked to complete a questionnaire and sign a consent form. Your answers will be discussed further with you before you start your treatment.



Oto-endoscopy: Once you enter the Ear Clinic you can relax. You can discuss your needs without feeling rushed. We will use the latest endoscope technology to view the health of the ear.



Education: There are a choice of large monitors so we can view and discuss the now visible problem, its cause, how best to treat it and if the problem may reoccur.



To minimise risk, we do not use portable pumps, headlamps or head mounted magnification to view the ear. We use an ENT specified microscope. If irrigation is required, we utilise an 38 degree auto pre-heated irrigator.

Microsuction: A fully adjustable, powerful LED microscope, HD camera/video and foot pedals ensure our hands are free to work safely. A small suction tube is placed in the ear canal.



Moisturise and trim: Removing wax can stimulate the ear to produce more wax. We use a special atomiser to replace oils and moisturise. We will also trim excessive ear hair.



Review and plan: You will see before and after images, to compare. If excessive wax is a recurrent problem for you, an annual reminder may be required.

HOW NOT TO Manage Earwax

Ear Candles Ear candles do not produce enough suction, via the advertised "chimney effect", to remove wax. It is not an approved treatment. It is unwise to pay a therapist to place a burning candle in the ear. Hopi candles have never been used by the Hopi Tribe of North America as claimed.




Cotton Buds Although commonly used, it is not recommended to push anything into the ear canal. Risks include pushing wax deeper into the ear and trauma to the canal or eardrum. The latter may be accompanied by extreme pain and a visit to A&E required.



Self-Irrigate More products that introduce solutions into the ear under pressure, are becoming available. Is the level of pressure used safe or the product necessary for the individual? It is safer and more effective to see a qualified professional, receive the correct treatment and resolve the problem.
